**Charles B. Strozier, Ph.D.**, is Emeritus Professor of History at the Graduate Center of The City University of New York and past professor of History at John Jay College. He received his B.A. from Harvard University and his M.A. and Ph.D. from the University of Chicago. Dr. Strozier has been a research candidate in the Chicago Institute for Psychoanalysis and a clinical graduate from the Training and Research Institute in Self Psychology [TRISP]. He has been an active member of TRISP since its founding.

Dr. Strozier is the recipient of numerous awards and has written many journal articles and books on aspects of history and psychoanalysis. A few of his books include *Heinz Kohut: The Making of a Psychoanalyst*, (Farrar, Straus & Giroux, 2001) which remains in print and has been translated into Italian, Japanese, and, just last year, Hebrew; *Apocalypse: On The Psychology of Fundamentalism in America* (Beacon Press, 1994) and *Lincoln's Quest for Union: Public and Private Meanings* (New York, Basic Books, 1982). Dr. Strozier maintains a private practice in psychoanalysis in northern Florida.
