So often, families get stuck. Children can become angry and defensive – and so have their parents. Argument begets argument. Criticism and punishment lead to anger and defiance, or secretiveness and withdrawal. Parents can feel as if they have “tried everything” and just don’t know what to do. Whether our clients are children, adolescents, or adults, parents ask for our help.

In this presentation, guidance will be offered on how therapists can help parents solve these problems – how we can help parents restore and strengthen feelings of joyfulness and pride in their relationships with their children. Solutions to the repetitive and disheartening conflicts that are a source of distress to many thoughtful and caring parents will be offered.
